Dear St. Mark members and friends,

April showers bring May flowers. As I write this, I hear a lovely shower outside my window and the gentle swishing of cars on the street. I know my wife is happy because she has been busy preparing her garden and planting seeds. You can do all the prep work, but without water it won't matter. Of course, we use our sprinklers to water, but it's pretty expensive. Rain is a free gift of God's grace!

As I mentioned in last month's newsletter, March is a time for planting seeds. We engage people and invite them to events at the church, especially Easter Sunday. You may have noticed that we are starting to have some new plants springing up (new people-in case you aren't following me!). These new people did not come from nowhere. Seeds were planted. They were invited by someone in the congregation. But planting seeds is not where the work of a gardener ends.

Now we water. We nourish the new seedlings with lots of love. Perhaps it seems like an awful lot of work to grow a church, but we are not alone in it. From time to time, God gives us rain. Ultimately, it's his garden. He just put us in it to tend it. But God is in charge of the rain and the sunshine, which is what plants need to grow. Part of our job is to trust that God is doing things with people that having nothing to do with our effort. God is pouring out grace into people all the time whether we know it or not.

We have our part to play. We tend the soil, plant seeds, weed, prune, water during dry times. April is a time for watering and trusting that if we are faithful in our task, God will always be faithful in bringing fruit. We hope that many new people will have attended services and events at the church in March, and now we water. What does that mean?

We don't just say, "We hope to see you again next Easter!" We begin relationships with people. We listen to the stories of their lives. We pray for them. We help them with whatever they are dealing with if we can. We become sources of encouragement and acceptance for them.

Two things that nobody gets enough of in this hard soiled world are good listening and encouragement. Listening is a way of watering people. Being heard is a rare and wonderful gift. It helps people to know that they matter. And when you listen to people don't just say, "Well good luck with all that." Encourage them. People get all the discouragement they can handle from people and circumstances, but they rarely get encouragement. Encouragement is like a rain shower in April. By listening and encouraging you will see withered, wilting people begin to bloom. Through them and by God's grace we will see our church bloom.

Ah what a beautiful world it will be in May, if we shower our neighbors with the love of Christ in April!





TREASURER'S REPORT OPERATING FUND

8 Mos 7/2023 - 2/2024



<u>Operating Fund</u> – YTD unrestricted contributions are \$8,600 better than budget, and \$5,400 ahead of last year. YTD expenses are \$1,000 below budget, and \$26,300 above last year. Bottom line, we are approximately \$7,400 positive YTD, which is \$8,800 better than budgeted.



It's April. This may be my favorite time of year. Spring is here, winter is over, and the long hot summer is still several weeks away.

The heat is often off. The air conditioning is not yet on. Windows are open. Things are in bloom all over. It's usually a time when I feel like a celebration.

Most years the celebration of Easter is part of our April activities. But we had an "earlyish" Easter this year. Twenty years ago, we also had a March Easter. What follows is an adaptation of what I shared back in 2004. By the time you are reading this a few days have likely passed since all of the festivities of Easter Sunday. For some of us Easter day may already seem almost like ancient history. However, I'd like you to consider prolonging your Easter celebration this year. Here's a question I'd like to toss out: What if every day we attempted to intentionally live our lives as acts of celebration?

What might that look like? Well, it's not about chocolate and egg hunts every day.

The events of Passion Week reminded us of how much God loves each one of us and how powerful God's grace is. That love is something that calls for a long-term celebration. So how might we do that? There are a couple of questions and answers in one of the newer Presbyterian catechisms that remind us of how we can gracefully respond to that love:

How do you thank God for this gift of love? I promise to love and trust God with all my heart. How do you love God?

By worshiping God, by loving others, and by respecting what God has created.

Don't forget that those are not things that we do to earn God's love. They are the things we are called to do in response to the gift of God's love. Worshiping God, loving others, and respecting what God has created are ways that we can live our lives in ways that celebrate the joy of Easter.

Let me encourage you to think about and take advantage of opportunities that you may have in the coming days to do those things that may show our love for God. And when the opportunities present themselves, I hope that you will do them not just out of a sense of obligation but also with a spirit of Easter celebration.

Covenant Committee Report

The St. Mark/Eastminster Covenant Committee met on January 25, 2024. For those of you who are unsure what the Covenant Committee is, please continue reading!

We share Pastor Paul with Eastminster Presbyterian Church. The close proximity of the two churches, as well as the size of each church, and the experienced congregations seemed to suggest that "pastor sharing" just might work. It has been a huge success and may serve as a model for other churches in the Presbytery.

St. Mark's Covenant Committee representatives are Bill Grayson, Gary O'Neal, and Susie Miller. Representatives from Eastminster include four of their veteran members and Pastor Paul chairs the committee. The goal is for our two churches to work together to reinforce each church's successful autonomy and share some programming and ideas when possible. So far, Eastminster has invited St. Mark to visit its Saturday Morning Breakfast and shared information regarding its Pleasant Grove Food Pantry. St. Mark shared its food pantry and Sandwich Sunday successes.


Our two churches celebrated Shrove Tuesday at Eastminster (very successfully with over 60 people in attendance). Eastminster, El Divino, and Journey gathered at St. Mark to participate in our Ash Wednesday service. Over 70 people were in attendance.

During Holy Week, the Maundy Thursday service was held at St. Mark following a Soup Supper and the Good Friday service was held at Eastminster. Both churches celebrated Easter Sunday at their own locations.

Events planned for the Spring include a joint communion "Gospel Mass" and a joint choir/Eastfield Brass concert. And more plans are in the making!

So far, the Spirit has blessed our efforts individually and collectively to make it work. Special thanks to Pastor Paul for his energy, enthusiasm, and faith. It takes all of us to make this work!
