



I want to introduce you to a model for church vitality that I have been working on that I will believe will aid St. Mark to deepen its discipleship and grow as a community. I will be preaching on these concepts to kick off the new year. Let's call it "An Overflowing Church." Some of us are glass half empty folks and some are glass half full. God doesn't want us to be half full or empty. God wants to overflow our cups!

The Four Levels of An Overflowing Church:

- 1) **Hearing** and **believing** the Gospel of Jesus Christ and that with God nothing is impossible.
- 2) **Learning** the Bible and **developing** a deeper relationship with God through prayer.
- 3) Responding to God by **giving** and **serving**.
- 4) Overflowing Level: **Engaging** people with the Gospel and **inviting** them to join St. Mark.

We are already working at the first three levels of an Overflowing Church. The more fully we engage in those first levels, the more natural the fourth level will become to us. Engaging people with the Gospel and inviting them to join our community will be what overflows in you as you grow in the first three levels. Engaging people with the Gospel and inviting them to church is the only tried and true way to grow numerically as a church. It's how the church has grown since Jesus first invited his first disciples to follow him.

You will know you have grown mature in the first three levels when engaging people with the Gospel becomes second nature for you. Let's spend 2024 becoming filled to overflowing with the life of God!



5 MONTHS THROUGH 11-30-2023

Operating Fund – YTD unrestricted contributions are \$1,300 below budget, and \$7,400 below last year. YTD expenses are \$2,900 below budget, and \$13,300 above last year. Bottom line, we are approximately \$3,100 positive YTD, which is \$1,400 better than budgeted but \$9,600 behind last year.

Ok, you know that I reuse ideas and repeat themes on a regular basis. This month is one of those months. I was looking back at previous January articles to see what I was thinking about as a new year began in past years. I decided to reuse last year's article and add some commentary and pondering it the end. It may be a chance to look back and forward at the same time. So here we go.

"The other day I was reading Matthew 2 for a different project. I was focusing on the second half of the chapter starting at 2:13. It is a familiar story, but you might want to read it before you read the rest of my article.

(I'll wait while you read. FYI... my favorite online Bible is the Oremus Bible Browser: <u>https://bible.oremus.org/</u> I have it open to Matthew 2 on my iPad as I write. OK, have you had time to finish reading? Great. Back to my writing.)

I don't know how many times I have read this chapter and the story of what happened after the wise men came looking for Jesus. But this time something jumped out at me that I don't recall noticing before.

Twice an angel or messenger from God appeared to Joseph in a dream. I remembered that. But it is the command of the messenger that jumped out at me. Both times it was a command to "get up." The first was to get up and flee to Egypt. The second was to get up and leave Egypt. And both times Joseph obeyed the command.

As we start a new year, I am fascinated by the command to "get up." I have never had a messenger from God exactly like Joseph. But I believe that God still calls people and congregations to do particular things. There have been times when I have sensed a call from God. Often it comes not in a dream but through the voice of a trusted friend. And there have been times when in hindsight I didn't listen or misunderstood the call.

So, I am wondering if we as individuals or together as a congregation might experience calls to "get up" this year. I wonder what we might be called to do if that happens. Get up and do what. Hmmm. I wonder how we will respond. I hope we will be listening. What do you think?"

Thanks for rereading. As you think about last year, did we (or you) experience any calls to "get up?" Were they dramatic or very quiet? How did we (or you) respond? How is it going?

If we (or your) didn't respond there is no need to spend too much time dwelling on it. After all it is a new year! A chance to look forward and think about what God might be up to with us.

And as I said last year: So, I am wondering if we as individuals or together as a congregation might experience calls to "get up" this year. I wonder what we might be called to do if that happens. Get up and do what. Hmmm. I wonder how we will respond. I hope we will be listening.
