You gardeners out there know that March is an important month. You are prepping for the springtime plants – cooler plants like lettuce, potatoes, and tomatoes. You have to weed, prepare the topsoil, and start planting the seeds. My wife has been carefully mulching all our organic garbage bits for months. She's so excited.

The church is very much like a garden.

March is a big month – especially this year. It ends with Easter Sunday, which is the Super Bowl of Sundays. It is consistently the biggest attendance day of the year. It is a day when all able members are present, and our neighbors are more open to coming – IF they are invited by someone they trust. We pull out all the stops with glorious music. We proclaim our most important message: Jesus has risen from the dead and those who believe in him will one day follow.

But we are looking for more than just a glorious day. This day is an opportunity to bring forth a crop of new disciples. In the old days of the church, Easter was the day when the new communicants were baptized. It was a spiritual birthday. Months and even years of preparation went into such a day. And like gardening, we cannot expect a fruitful garden to just spring up just because it rained, and the sun shone bright. We have work to do.

Now is the time to begin preparing people to join us for Easter Sunday. First, ask for the Spirit to introduce you to people whom you are called to invite. It could be family, neighbors, or even perfect strangers. Start preparing the soil now. Listen to people in their struggles. Pray for them. Encourage them with scripture. And then plant the seeds of joining you for church.

Tell them it is a place and community where healing happens and together, we are learning to become loving people. It is not a place for perfect people who have their lives together (as if those people exist). It is a garden where a better world is being born in our hearts – where we are tended by a loving God and tend to each other in God's loving ways. It is a place and community where people can discover their true purpose on this earth. It is a place and a community where people are not valued for their usefulness but just for who they are – as they are right now.

A gardener knows the joy of seeing those first green sprouts peeking out of the well-loved soil and the greater joy of the fruit that emerges in time. Let us be faithful gardeners this March and prepare to rejoice in God's wonderful garden!


Christians around the world will observe Holy Week beginning with Palm Sunday on March 24th (the 6th Sunday of Lent) and ending with Holy Saturday on March 30th. There will be four special services during Holy Week and Easter:

- 1. We will observe Palm Sunday on March 24th in our 9:45 a.m. worship service with palm branches and music by our sanctuary choir.
- 2. On Maundy Thursday, March 28th at 6:30 p.m., communion will be celebrated in our sanctuary with Eastminster Presbyterian. This is a Covenant event that will also include Journey Church and El Divino as invited guests. A combined St. Mark and Eastminster choir along with our handbell choir will provide music.
- 3. On Good Friday, March 29th, we will take part in a Covenant service at Eastminster Presbyterian Church at 6:30 pm. This service, "The Stations of the Cross", will also include a combined St. Mark/Eastminster choir. Eastminster's address is 6550 Samuell Blvd, Dallas, Texas.
- 4. Easter Sunday, March 31st, begins a new church season called Eastertide, when we will celebrate the resurrection of our Lord. The somber purples and blacks of Lent will be replaced with white paraments along with colorful flowers that will decorate the chancel. Easter day will begin with a continental breakfast hosted by the Fellowship Committee beginning at 8:45 a.m. All are welcome! The Easter Sunday worship service will begin at 9:45 a.m. in the sanctuary. To make the journey of Holy Week the most meaningful experience, we hope you will consider, if possible, attending all the services leading up to and including Easter Sunday.
