I remember telling a coaching client who was taking a grand trip to Europe, "I know you are going on a vacation, but don't be surprised if God meets you there." How true this became for me on my recent trip to Scotland. We were walking back to our hotel from visiting the stunningly beautiful Glasgow Cathedral. We felt like maybe we had taken the wrong route. We had turned into a rough neighborhood and there was nothing much of historical value to see. As we hurried through the dodgy environs, I looked up from the GPS on my phone and a mural on the side of an apartment building stopped me in my tracks.

I don't know what other people see when viewing this art or what the artist intended, but what I saw made me immediately think of the classic song lyrics, "His eye is on the sparrow and I know he watches me." God in this mural is not kingly or stunningly beautiful, he looks like a homeless man. His love and care for this tiny creature is clearly evident. As impressed as I was by the grand

cathedral, standing before this painting is where God met me on my vacation. I knew in that moment that God was with me, watching over me, caring for me, loving me—just like he does for the sparrows and everyone else.

Jesus taught, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?" (Matt. 6:25-26) How much energy and time have I wasted worrying about my life and hurrying through the uncomfortable moments? And yet, God has me perched on his finger feeding me with what I need. You will see that the same is true for you if you just look up from your concerns for a moment.

Donation baskets will be placed below the Christmas Tree in the parlor. Let's fill lots of baskets for Christmas 2023!



<u>Operating Fund</u> — YTD unrestricted contributions are \$2,600 below budget, and \$6,600 below last year. YTD expenses are \$2,400 below budget, and \$4,200 above last year. Bottom line, we are approximately \$600 cash positive, which is \$400 below budget and \$4,200 behind last year.
