But after reading a prayer that Billy Graham wrote a few years ago, I realized that he expressed much more effectively what I wanted to say. "Our Father and our God, as we stand at the beginning of this new year we confess our need of Your presence and Your guidance as we face the future.

"We each have our hopes and expectations for the year that is ahead of us—but You alone know what it holds for us, and only You can give us the strength and the wisdom we will need to meet its challenges. So help us to humbly put our hands into Your hand, and to trust You and to seek Your will for our lives during this coming year.

"In the midst of life's uncertainties in the days ahead, assure us of the certainty of Your unchanging love. In the midst of life's inevitable disappointments and heartaches, help us to turn to You for the stability and comfort we will need. In the midst of life's temptations and the pull of our stubborn self-will, help us not to lose our way but to have the courage to do what is right in Your sight, regardless of the cost. And in the midst of our daily preoccupations and pursuits, open our eyes to the sorrows and injustices of our hurting world, and help us to respond with compassion and sacrifice to those who are friendless and in need. "We pray for our nation and its leaders during these difficult times, and for all those who are seeking to bring peace and justice to our dangerous and troubled world. We pray especially for Your protection on all those who serve in our armed forces, and we thank You for their commitment to defend our freedoms, even at the cost of their own lives. Be with their families also, and assure them of Your love and concern for them. Bring our divided nation together, and give us a greater vision of what You would have us to be. Your Word reminds us that 'Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord' (Psalm 33:12).

May we never presume on Your past goodness or forget all Your mercies to us, but may they instead lead us to repentance, and to a new commitment to make You the foundation and center of our lives this year.

This is good news to claim and to hold onto as we move deeper into the unknowns of 2014 and beyond.





Treasurer's Report for the Five months ending 11/30/13

- ⇒ Operating Fund income is \$7,000 below budget and \$1,500 less than last year. Expenses are \$1,200 below budget and \$2,300 above last year.
- ⇒ <u>Capital and Facilities Fund</u> income is \$300 above budget and expenditures are \$1,100 below budget.

- The Mission and Outreach Fund helps provide support for the agencies that we assist through the Operating Fund. If you wish to provide additional assistance to this area of our congregation's ministry, please consider a Faith Promise to this fund.
