One of the most helpful memorization techniques I use is to build an acrostic. For instance, during my personal prayer time I employ ACTS: Adoration, Confession/Contrition, Thanksgiving and Supplication. Another helpful acrostic comes from one of my favorite authors—Dallas Willard. He generally wrote about Christian formation, and has left a legacy of encouragement for followers of Jesus to, well, live more like Jesus. In his book "Renovation of the Heart" he introduces VIM—Vision, Intention and the Means of spiritual discipline. I'm sure that this acrostic resonated with me because of its harkening to my youth, when advertisements for vitamins and other supplements claimed to restore "vim" to someone suffering from lethargy. "Just take our product and turn back the hands of time!" the ads claimed. Willard's VIM cast a larger net than miracle cures: A Christian with **Vision** and **Intention** should

practice the **Means** of spiritual discipline to lead a truly blessed life.

Willard found encouragement in the longest teaching by Jesus in the Bible—the "Sermon on the Mount," found in chapters five through seven of Matthew's Gospel. To Willard, those passages define what we, as Christians, need to do to become the people God intends us to be. The spiritual disciplines of prayer, fasting, detachment from misusing of wealth, forgiveness, compassion, and other intentional actions provide a path to this end that pleases God.

As a philosophy professor at the University of Southern California from 1963 until his death in 2013, Willard was exposed to many worldviews. In his estimation, Jesus' "Sermon on the Mount" expressed the finest way to know true and lasting peace. Beginning May 10, I will preach a series that explores a better way of living as taught by Jesus through the "Sermon on The Mount". Be courageous as we take this path, because Jesus sets lofty standards for his followers.

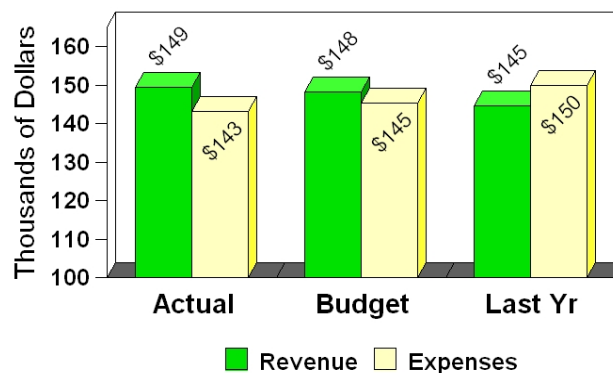

Hometown Nazareth Vacation Bible School

June 22 - 25th, 6:00 p.m. - 7:45 p.m.

"Hometown Nazareth: Where Jesus was a Kid" will be hosted at St. Mark from June 22 - June 25. We will transport kids back to Nazareth where they'll learn firsthand what it was like when Jesus was a kid. Kids and adults will experience what daily life was like in Nazareth, sing catchy songs, play teamwork-building games, dig into Bible-times snacks, and make fun crafts to remind them of God's Word. Each day begins and concludes at Celebration - a time of upbeat worship that gets everyone involved.

Tribes will visit Mary, the mother of Jesus, at her house where she shares stories about Jesus when he was a kid. They will go to the Synagogue where the Rabbi will teach them about charity and collecting for the poor. The marketplace includes a Shepherd Shop, Olive Oil Shop, Farmers Field, and the Farmers Market where they will taste foods from Jesus' time.

Kids and adults at Hometown Nazareth VBS will collect canned and boxed food items to be donated to White Rock Center of Hope.

* Later this month Joanne Szalay and I will be attending an introductory workshop on a new curriculum that has been developed by our denomination. I have not seen the material so I do not know if it will meet our needs at St. Mark. But I do love the title. It is called **Growing in Grace and Gratitude**. What do you think of that title? What do you think it means for God’s children of all ages to be growing in grace and gratitude? What are some things that you think we could do at St. Mark to help each other to be growing in grace and gratitude?

* Once again we will have Vacation Bible School for young children at St. Mark. For four evenings June 22-25 the Family Center will be transformed into the town of Nazareth where Jesus grew up. Our Christian Education team always does a great job with VBS. Watch for more details in the next few weeks. And be thinking about children you may know who might benefit from participating in VBS at St. Mark.

* Did you know it looks like we had a larger number of children involved in our Easter activities than we have had in several years? Isn’t that good news?

* We have information about the 2015 Summer Camp offerings at Gilmont. Do you know of a child who would like

to go? There are a number of scholarship resources available. We should be able to make sure that any child who wants or needs to go to camp will have the resources to do so.

* There will be an Adult Vacation Bible School again this year. The theme will be “Fire.” It will in the mornings on August 3-6 and will be sponsored by the East Dallas Cluster. St. Mark will host on Monday. Watch for more details early in the summer.

* I now serve on the Congregational Support Committee of Grace Presbytery. The CSC has a number of responsibilities. But one of the most important is that we administer the Presbytery’s “Mission Initiative Grants.” These grants provide congregations with up to \$3000 in seed money to start new ministries. Can you think of something **NEW** that St. Mark might be able to do if we had \$3000 to help us get started?

* Have you checked out the worship bags for children that we now have available every Sunday in the sanctuary?

* I have been changing the material on my “Odds and Ends” bulletin board on a regular basis. I hope you have been reading it and talking about some of the things I post.
