Jimmy Carter, whether one agrees or not with his decisions made while serving as our 39th president, is a man deserving of our admiration. When it comes to adding up the full measure of a man, this 2002 Nobel laureate receives high marks from even his detractors as being "one of the good guys." In other words, his positives far outweigh his negatives.

Jimmy Carter is acknowledged as really coming into his own after leaving office, most notably through his humanitarian efforts. Let's examine a list of what he has tackled over the years since leaving public office: peace making among nations, human rights initiatives, aiding the international political democratic process, helping low income people with long-term housing through Habitat for Humanity (which included personally laboring on some of the projects), and something that few have wanted to take on - eradicating the parasitic guinea worm. Some would say he's been a more effective leader while out of office than in. He's been one very busy man.

But now Jimmy Carter's commitment schedule of service to others is being curtailed by cancer. Liver cancer was diagnosed in May and during a recent news

conference, he announced that the cancer had spread to his brain. What caught my attention was his reaction to the cancer news and pending treatment.

"I'm perfectly at ease with whatever comes," Carter told reporters. "I do have deep religious faith, which I'm grateful for, and I was pleasantly surprised that I didn't go into an attitude of despair or anger or anything like that. I was just completely at ease."

I like to think that Jimmy Carter had the words of the Apostle Paul in mind during that public announcement:

⁴Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. ⁵Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. ⁶Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:4-7)

Jimmy Carter has been a Sunday School teacher for decades. He knows the Bible well, relying on it for comfort and strength. He proves that there is a difference between mastering the Bible and being mastered by the Bible. I want to be like Jimmy Carter.



Christian Education Updates

The yellow school zone lights are flashing again. That means all the schools around St. Mark are back in session. A new year of teaching and learning has begun. I hope you will continue to pray for all the students and staff all year long.

The Christian Education year has started at St. Mark.

* We have new curriculum resources for our elementary aged children. They are called "Growing in Grace and Gratitude." You can see some samples along with other information on the Christian Education bulletin board. We will start using them in September.

* We are anticipating the delivery of a new set of story books for preschoolers. "God Loves Me Storybooks" are a set of 52 books designed to be used over and over again with preschoolers. This will be an exciting new addition to our collection of resources.

* On September 13th in worship we will be giving Bibles to five children who are entering the third and

fourth grades this year. We have picked an edition of the NRSV translation that has been designed for this age group. When we present the Bibles we will also give the children a bookmark with a list of the favorite Bible passages of some of our leaders.

* Of course Christian Education is not just from children. We always need to be growing in grace and gratitude no matter what our age. We have several Sunday School options, The Wednesday morning Bible Study is open to all adults, and Rick offers inquirers classes throughout the year.

* My "Odds and Ends" bulletin board will once again feature timely items that I think may be of interest to you.

* The CE Committee is always open to offering special seminars on appropriate topics. If you have an idea let us know.
